After graduating from Skyline High School, he received his Bachelors and teaching credential from San Francisco State University. For the next 35 years, he was a passionate and committed teacher, first at King Estates Jr. High, then Bret Harte Jr. High, and later at Oakland High School. In his retirement, Pat loved spending time with his family and friends, which he often did at baseball games, while hiking, traveling, at the movies, or over coffee or a shared meal. 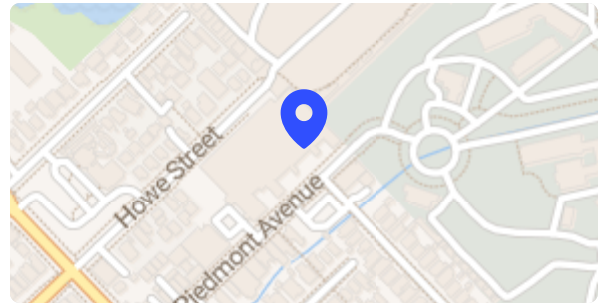
