Our beloved Aunt Carmen of Oakland, California passed away at the age of 83 on February 9th 2019, in Danville, CA.

Carmen attended San Francisco State University; where she majored in English. She worked for the Catholic Diocese of San Francisco and then moved to the Catholic Diocese of Oakland and served the Catholic Church for over 50 years. She became the historical archivist and helped in the writing and publishing of a book entitled "The Diocese of Oakland." Carmen also worked closely with the Hispanic community of Oakland; as a translator in the medical community.
